Your son or daughter is joining an Operation Wallacea expedition this summer. As part of that experience they are going to be travelling to one of the most incredible and remote locations on the planet, and they're going to get to experience things few people rarely get the opportunity to. Operation Wallacea have been running expeditions like this for almost twenty years, and during that time we've had tens of thousands of students and staff join our programs and have safe, enjoyable and life changing experiences.

However, we can appreciate that for many of our participants' parents and loved ones it can be nerve-racking when your child travels on a project like this, particularly when they may never have done so before. The first and most important thing to note is that due to the remote nature of our projects it is not unusual for our participants to either not have the ability or opportunity to call or contact home for extended periods of time.
